Announcing the Christine Beattie Travel Award

The Christine Beattie Travel Award has been established to honor the memory of Dr. Christine Beattie (1965 – 2018) and her commitment to training the next generation. Christine was a developmental neurobiologist who made numerous contributions to our understanding of neuromuscular development and disease using the zebrafish model. During her postdoctoral years with Judith Eisen at the University of Oregon, Christine began working on zebrafish motoneuron development, research she continued as an independent investigator at The Ohio State University. At Ohio State, Christine expanded her studies to understand how motor axons are disrupted in



neuromuscular disease, specifically Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA), and developed one of the most genetically accurate zebrafish models of a human disease.

IZFS responds to NICHD's request for strategic plan feedback

In January 2019, the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute for Child Health and Human Development (NICHD) solicited feedback on a draft of their proposed five year strategic plan (Read the full plan here). The strategic plan lays out the research themes, goals and opportunities that will receive priority from NICHD. Given NICHD is a critical institute supporting research using model organisms, including zebrafish, to fulfill its mission, it was important for IZFS to provide feedback on the plan in support of the zebrafish community. The response from IZFS was written by Mary Mullins, current president of IZFS, and David Grunwald, IZFS member, and sent to NICHD. The text is provided below.

"We appreciate the vision of the NICHD in developing Five Year Strategic Plans and in seeking input from experienced investigators and interested parties regarding the goals and research priorities of the 2020-2024 Strategic Plan. The current Draft of the Strategic Plan sets forth many laudable Research Themes and Goals. The Draft Plan falls short, however, in failing to recognize and call for crucial research strategies using model organisms in all six research themes, which are needed to advance maximally the stated goals in the NICHD plan."
